APG Volunteers and Visitors (<u>Read more here</u>)

All visitors to our school, including parents, must sign in at the security desk and receive proper authorization to be in the school. Visitors may be asked by our school site staff to display their passes as requested at any time. Our APG Principal has the authority to prohibit conduct or activity that may interfere with student safety, interfere with instruction, or otherwise disrupt normal school activities. The following types of restrictions shall apply to minimize disruptions and safety concerns at school sites. However, this list is not exhaustive and our Principal may develop additional reasonable restrictions:

- 1. Visitors should make advance arrangements to meet with school staff to minimize the interruption of instructional time and work responsibilities. UESF Teachers Contract Section 14.2.5 requires 24 hours advance notice prior to a classroom observation unless agreed to otherwise by both parties.
- 2. School and classroom observations must be limited to 30 minutes to avoid disruption (including observations by parents or parent-invited assessors), unless alternative arrangements have been made, or except where the observation is being made by an assessor in accordance with CA Education Code 56329 (b). Note that all non-parent observers must be accompanied by school staff for observations and this must be pre-arranged.
- Students visiting another school must have prior authorization from the home school Principal, as well as the site Principal before 3. entering our school site during school hours.
- Dogs or other pets are NOT permitted on any school sites at any time. This restriction does not apply to service animals. 4.

SFUSD Student GE Ridership Cards

SFUSD student ridership cards are required to enter and exit the general education school bus.

Every student approved for ridership was issued a student ridership card, which ensures that students arrive at their destinations safely.

Starting on November 28th, any students without a ridership card will <u>not</u> be allowed to ride the GE bus.



Absences

- To report an absence, please call our counseling office at 415-759-2773 or email our attendance clerk, Stacey Dawson, at dawsons@sfusd.edu
- 2. Written notes or emails from parents will be required for excusing absences.
 - a. Notes should include:

i. Date of Note, Student Name & Grade, Dates of Absence, Reason for Absence, Parent Name & Signature 3. Students should drop off written notes to the counseling office the day they return back to school. Please allow a few days for attendance to be updated on the attendance system. Thanks for your patience.

Early Dismissal

It is recommended that medical, dental, or other appointments be scheduled after school, on school holidays, or during vacation periods. 1. Obtaining a permit to leave pass in advance: Please have your child come to the counseling office to pick up a Permit to Leave Pass before school, start of school or after school with a written note or email to attendance clerk Stacey Dawson at <u>dawsons@sfusd.edu</u>. a. Students without a written note or email from a parent will not be allowed to leave the school campus. Parents will be called to verify. Parents on-site pick up: Please sign out your child using the sign-out book. Counselor or secretary will call students out of class. We recommend that parents do not come during school lunch hours as it is hard to find students (see bell schedule).

Late Arrival to School - Tardies

- Students who arrive late to school should first go to the Counseling Office to get a tardy pass, then they go to their class with their pass.
- **Excusing Tardies**: Students should bring a written note with them to the office from their parent or a note from their medical provider, especially if their parent is not with the student during drop-off.

SFUSD COVID-19 and All Illness Protocol

What to do if your student does not feel well?

If your student is exhibiting any of the symptoms below, please have your student stay home and rest. In order to return to school, your student will need a negative test result for Covid-19. Both PCR/NAAT/molecular and antigen tests are acceptable for testing for Covid-19.

What to do if your student tests positive for Covid-19?

SFUSD continues to work with the SF Department of Public Health to implement health and safety protocols to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 in schools. Based on <u>updated public health guidance</u> on December 31, 2021:

Students and staff who have tested positive for COVID-19 can return after 5 days of isolation if:

- They no longer have a fever, AND
- Their symptoms are getting better, AND
- They have a negative test collected on or after day 5.

Both PCR/NAAT/molecular and antigen tests are acceptable.
