Financial Review - 23/24 Year



- Check Ratifications for 23/24
 - Checks created between last General Meeting on 5/1/24 through end of 6/30/24
 - Motion: Request the General Membership to Ratify 19 checks/expenses totaling \$37,689.55
- 23/24 Year End Actuals vs Budget
 - Fundraising came in slightly higher than expected and our expenses were not fully utilized



Financial Review - 24/25 Year



Draft Budget for 24/25

- Minor adjustments from last year's budget to align with actual spend while keeping our fundraising targets realistic
- Incorporated feedback from May General Meeting
- Motion: Request the General Membership Approve, Ratify, and Release the 24/25 Budget as shown

Current July 2024 Actuals

- Received \$4,127.53 in donations for August so far
- Completed Gear Sale of \$4,206.35 (\$500 more than last year's event)

Algebra 1 in 8th **Grade** 2024 -**2025 APG**




Schools that are part of the Algebra 1 middle grades pilot in 24

- Algebra 1 for All is being piloted at A.P.
 Giannini Middle School, Alice Fong Yu K
 8 school, and Roosevelt Middle
 School.
- 2. Readiness and interest is being piloted at Rooftop K 8.
- 3. Additional Math Period is being piloted at Aptos, Willie Brown Jr., Everett, Francisco, Marina, and Presidio Middle Schools.

Algebra for All at APG:

In this prototype, all students are enrolled in Algebra I in eighth grade.



Affordances

- We will not have two tracks, a "high track" and a "low track," which effectively sorts across the entire school day
- The entire math department at APG has agreed to pilot both the Algebra for All course sequencing model at 8th grade and the Desmos Amplify math curriculum 6 - 8
- Students can accelerate earlier in their math academic career

Complexities

- Our students are progressing from Common Core Math 7 directly into high school Algebra
 There are many standards in Math 8 that our students will not have seen: linear expressions and functions, and solving systems of linear equations*
- Our 8th grade teachers are teaching new content with a new curriculum



Our school's design

- 1. We will use diagnostic assessments to understand the readiness of each student and understand who needs additional support.
- We have a Math Intervention Teacher who can support individuals and small groups.
- Desmos Amplify, SFUSD Curriculum and Instruction, and the New Teacher Project (TNTP) have offered guidance about which 8th grade lessons we should add to our Algebra 1 Scope and Sequence.
- 4. All 10 pilot schools will be giving design feedback to the district for future implementation.






