

Parent/Teacher Conference Week, March 2-6

Dear APG Families,

As a reminder, middle school **parent-teacher conferences are the week of 3/2 - 3/6 (2:20-4:00)**. Because we have 1,200 students, holding an individual parent conference for every child within the PTC window is impossible. For this reason, we prioritize conferences for students that the teachers identify. The grade-level counselors will be reaching out to families to schedule conferences with your child's teachers, or you may be interested in requesting a conference to find out how your child is doing and what you can do to partner with your child's teacher to make sure they have a successful school year. We encourage your children to participate in the conference. The conferences can either be virtual or in-person at A.P. Giannini.

Suppose you have yet to receive a request to meet for a conference from the counselors and are interested in connecting with your children's teachers to see how things are going this semester. In that case, you can schedule a conference by contacting the grade-level counselors. Our goal is to meet with all families interested in a conference.

SFUSD measures school quality by looking at the school's climate as well as the academic performance and social-emotional skills of the school's student body. By **March 19, 2026**, you are requested to participate in a short [online SEL/Culture-Climate Survey](#). The family Culture-Climate survey is one important way to help us understand how families feel about our school and their child's learning, and how APG can improve. Over the past two years, the San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD) tried out different ways (pilot) to offer Algebra I to all middle school students in 8th grade. At APG, we have had Algebra for All, for our 8th Graders. Community Input, Pilot: Different options were created with input from families, teachers, and principals. We gathered feedback a variety of ways: conversations with parent advisory groups, discussions at staff meetings, focus groups, and town hall meetings.

Pilot Models for Schools: Based on the community input, the following [Algebra 1 models](#) were finalized for middle and K-8 schools to choose from for the 2024-25 and 2025-26 school years. Again, APG has had Algebra for all our 8th grade students from 2024-2026. Options for students are: Algebra I as one of their Electives (in addition to Math 8); Math 8/Algebra I Compression; Algebra for All: (all 8th graders enrolled in Algebra I and skipped Math 8); and Online Algebra I.

ORDER YOUR APG YEARBOOK BY 4/17/26

Our 2025-26 APG Yearbook will have 110 pages; cost is \$34.98 soft cover, \$41.90 hard cover, before taxes.

To purchase the yearbook, follow the instructions below:

-If you already have a Treering account for a student at APG, log in and start on Step 4.

-If you already have a Treering account for another school, log in, go to “My Profile” and add APG by clicking “Add New School/Year” with the passcode on Step 2.

-If you are entirely new to Treering, start on Step 1.

1. Go to <http://www.treering.com/validate>
2. Enter A.P. Giannini's passcode: 1013464459651010
3. Create an account with student's full name (name that is on schedule), grade, and 1^o teacher (update to current 1st period teacher's name.)
4. Click the “Explore Yearbooks” button
5. Use the white button to choose Soft or Hard Cover
6. Click the black “Add to cart” button and click the shopping cart in the upper right corner.
7. Follow Treering's order process.

Students may also add 2 custom pages for their yearbook. Otherwise, they will receive 2 extra blank autograph pages.

It is our plan to have all yearbooks shipped to school and distributed to students in late May (shipping to school is free).

All yearbook orders should be placed by Friday, April 17, 2026 to ensure the yearbook is received by the end of the school year. Orders may be placed after that date, but the purchaser will need to pay for shipping to their home.

School Vehicle and Bike Rules

Due to new California laws effective January 1, 2026, and the increasing number of students riding vehicles to school (bikes, scooters, motorized vehicles, etc.), we are implementing these rules, effective immediately.

All APG students must:

- Wear a helmet while riding their vehicle (per state law)
- Lock their vehicle outside of school (there are racks in front of APG at 38th Avenue)
- NOT ride/bring their vehicle into school or the yard (except skateboards, which are stored on a rack in the counseling office)
- NOT ride with other students on their vehicle with them (i.e., one person per vehicle)

The following are legal vehicles for middle school students to ride to school:

- manual bikes
- manual scooters
- manual skateboards
- class 1 electric bikes

Per California law, these are illegal vehicles for middle school students to ride on streets and/or sidewalks:

- mini motorcycles/pocket bikes
- class 3 electric bikes
- electric scooters

Excused and Unexcused Absences

([SFUSD Board Policy 5113](#))

Valid Excused Absences (Absences Excused by State law)

Verification of student absences is accepted only from parents/guardians/caregivers, or the student if they are 18 years old or older.

CA Education Code 48205 states that a student shall be excused from school when the absence is:

- 1 Due to the pupil's illness, including an absence for the benefit of the pupil's mental or behavioral health.
- 2 Due to quarantine under the direction of a county or city health officer.
- 3 For the purpose of having medical, dental, optometric, or chiropractic services rendered.
- 4 For the purpose of attending the funeral services or grieving the death of either a member of the pupil's immediate family, or of a person that is determined by the pupil's parent or guardian to be in such close association with the pupil as to be considered the pupil's immediate family, so long as the absence is not more than five days per incident.
- 5 For the purpose of jury duty in the manner provided for by law.
- 6 Due to the illness or medical appointment during school hours of a child of whom the pupil is the custodial parent, including absences to care for a sick child, for which the school shall not require a note from a doctor.
