STUDENTS are encouraged to check for their missing belongings. PARENTS/ CAREGIVERS are also welcome to stop by the school office, sign-in, and visit the Lost and Found area during school hours, 9:00am - 4:00pm. The Lost and Found is located in the outdoor schoolyard, near the lunch tables. **Don't wait - drop by soon, before 6/3.**

Students who are SICK should stay home and recover. If parents/guardians get a call from school to pick up their unwell student, please come to APG to pick as soon as possible; do not wait till the end of the school day.

To report a full-day student absence, parents/guardians may use the [ParentVUE](#) portal and select "[Report Absence](#)." Please report absences by 9am for current day. Absences may be reported for the current day or a future date.

Parents/guardians may fill out the PTL ([Permit To Leave School!](#)) online form by 9am for a partial day absence. You can also find the form on the [APG school website](#) under the [Attendance tab](#). Students should pick up their PTL form from the counseling clerk, Ms. Dawson, between 9:00-9:30am and bring it with them when signing out early.

Please be sure that your application is **SUBMIT**. If the application says Incomplete that means it is incomplete and has not yet been submitted.

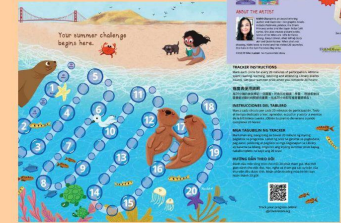

EXCUSED ABSENCES & ILLNESSES

What to do if your student does not feel well? PLEASE STAY AT HOME!

If your student is exhibiting any of the symptoms below, please have your student stay home and rest. For fever: please return to school after 24 hours of being fever-free, without medication, has passed.

Fever of 100.4° F or higher, body chills/shivers	Sore throat	Shortness of breath	Headache	New loss of smell or taste
Nausea or Vomiting	Diarrhea	Body aches	Fatigue	Cough
Pinkeye	Rash	Mouth Sores	Abdominal Pain	Runny Nose

Families may be contacted for further follow up if needed for an ill student. If you are called to pick up your sick student, please do so promptly or arrange for them to get home safely immediately. We have limited spaces in our Wellness Center/School for sick students to wait without exposing others. Excused and Unexcused Absences

([SFUSD Board Policy 5113](#))

Valid Excused Absences (Absences Excused by State law)

Verification of student absences is accepted only from parents/guardians/caregivers, or the student if they are 18 years old or older.

CA Education Code 48205 states that a student shall be excused from school when the absence is:

- 1 Due to the pupil's illness, including an absence for the benefit of the pupil's mental or behavioral health.
- 2 Due to quarantine under the direction of a county or city health officer.
- 3 For the purpose of having medical, dental, optometric, or chiropractic services rendered.
- 4 For the purpose of attending the funeral services or grieving the death of either a member of the pupil's immediate family, or of a person that is determined by the pupil's parent or guardian to be in such close association with the pupil as to be considered the pupil's immediate family, so long as the absence is not more than five days per incident.
- 5 For the purpose of jury duty in the manner provided for by law.
- 6 Due to the illness or medical appointment during school hours of a child of whom the pupil is the custodial parent, including absences to care for a sick child, for which the school shall not require a note from a doctor.
